
Directions: Character Body Book Report

Assembling Directions



Materials Needed:

• Pencil or Pen
• Color Pencils/Markers
 Scissors, Glue, and Tape
o <u>Optional</u> : Yarn and fabric




1. Begin with a 12" x 18" piece of white construction paper. Fold paper into eight equal sections.





2. Cut out the bottom left and bottom right sections. Save these two pieces to use as the arms later.



3. Fold sections 1 and 4 in towards the center to make a vest. Sections 1 and 4 will cover sections 2 and 3.





- 4. Glue the arms (sections 5 and 8) to the back of the construction paper, at an angle so that they look like arms.


5. If your character is male, cut out a triangle between sections 6 and 7, so that it looks like pants. If your character is female, trim sections 6 and 7 so that it looks like a skirt. If your character is thin, you may want to cut the arms thinner in width.



6. To color the clothing, use color pencils or markers. You may also glue on different colors of construction paper, or use pieces of fabric.



7. Make a head and neck for your character using construction paper. You may choose to use yarn for your character's hair. Then make hands, legs, and shoes for your character.

8. Now, try to add something to your project that makes your character unique. What would this character carry in their hands? Use your imagination and be creative!

Example:

Willy Wonka from <u>Charlie and the</u> <u>Chocolate Factory</u> would wear a top hat and hold a candy bar in his hand.



Gluing on the writing pieces:

Using your edited first draft, copy your writing into the text boxes on the correct template pages.

- 1. <u>If I Met</u>: Glue this rectangle to the <u>inside middle area</u> of your character's shirt.
- At the Beginning of this Book: Glue this rectangle to the inside left area of your character's vest.
- 3. <u>At the Beginning of this Book</u>: Glue this rectangle to the <u>inside right</u> area of your character's vest.
- 4. **<u>Pocket</u>**: Glue this pocket on the <u>outside left</u> area of your character's vest.
- 5. <u>Name and Date</u>: Glue this rectangle on the <u>outside right</u> area of your character's vest.
- 6. <u>10 Adjectives</u>: Glue these 10 adjective rectangles on the outside of your character's body.
